- WHEREAS, the Stockbridge-Munsee Community is a Federally recognized Indian Tribe with a Constitution approved November 18, 1937; and
- WHEREAS, the Stockbridge-Munsee Community is a sovereign government with the duty, responsibility and authority under said Constitution to enact legislation on behalf of the Community; and
- WHEREAS, the Stockbridge-Munsee Community having previously adopted a Liquor Ordinance to regulate the sale of alcohol beverages on tribal lands, that was submitted to and approved by the Secretary of Interior in 1992, and amended in 1998; and
- WHEREAS, the current Ordinance provides that alcohol may be sold "... within buildings used for casinos and restaurant-bar operations owned and regulated by the Stockbridge-Munsee Community . . . "; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe purchased a golf course in 1993 and continued the sale of alcohol there in the bar and restaurant, consistent with the current Liquor Ordinance; and
- WHEREAS, at some point after 1994 the tribal golf course management began the practice of selling beer from a beer cart out on the course, outside the bar and restaurant, for consumption on the premises of the golf course; and
- WHEREAS, this is not technically consistent with the provisions of the current Ordinance; and
 - WHEREAS, the Council does not object to the continued sale of beer from beer carts on the golf course for consumption on the course; now

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Stockbridge-Munsee Tribal Council, hereby approves the attached amended language to the Stockbridge-Munsee Liquor Control Ordinance.
