RESOLUTION

November 5, 2013 No. 07-14 WHEREAS, The Stockbridge-Munsee Community, Band of Mohican Indians, is a federally recognized Indian tribe with inherent sovereign powers, and is governed by the Stockbridge-Munsee Tribal Council pursuant to the 1937 Constitution: WHEREAS. The Stockbridge-Munsee Community has the authority under its Constitution and its inherent rights as a sovereign nation to adopt and amend Ordinances; WHEREAS. Chapter 21, the Fish and Wildlife Ordinance, was adopted in 1978 and has since be amended, most recently in October of 2012; and WHEREAS, The Fish and Wildlife Board recognizes that there are tribal members who using deer hunting as a means of providing food for their families; and WHEREAS, The Fish and Wildlife Board has therefore recommended that the Tribe add a new sustenance tag to allow such tribal members an opportunity to get up to 2 additional deer to provide sufficient nourishment to their household; and WHEREAS, Additional revisions to the ordinance have also been identified to clarify required permits and fees for permittees who are minors; and WHEREAS. The Tribal Council has directed that language be added to allow mentored hunting by 10

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Stockbridge-Munsee Tribal Council hereby adopts the following amendments to Chapter 21, which include the following changes:

Amending subsections 21.8 (A)(2); 21.8 (C)(1); 21.8 (D); and 21.9 (B)(2).

and 11 year-old hunters.

• Adding new subsection 21.8 (I); adding new subparts 21.8 (I)(1)-(4); adding new subsection 21.8 (J); and adding new subparts 21.8 (J)(1)-(4).
