ALASKA FELLOW

The Native American Rights Fund ("NARF") in Anchorage, Alaska, is seeking a current third-year law student, current law clerk, or recent law school graduate with a strong background in federal Indian law and public service for a two-year fellowship as NARF's Alaska Fellow, starting September 2020 or sooner, if the selected Fellow is available.

JOB TITLE: Alaska Fellow

JOB SUMMARY: Proactively seek out and creatively develop, lead, and implement projects or litigation that advances tribal sovereignty in Alaska; work with NARF Staff Attorneys and NARF clients in all aspects of complex impact litigation, including factual and legal research, discovery, motion practice, trials, appeals, and amicus briefs; identify and research tribal sovereignty issues, and write demand letters, legal memoranda, and advocacy letters; represent NARF and NARF clients before various community and stakeholder groups; represent NARF clients before federal and state agencies and in regulatory proceedings; build and lead coalitions with diverse stakeholders and work in partnership with other organizations. Position is for two years only and is not a guarantee of full-time NARF employment after the end of the fellowship.

QUALIFICATIONS: J.D. from an ABA-accredited law school; a license to practice law in Alaska, the ability to sit for the September 2020 or February 2021 Alaska Bar exam, or to be admitted by reciprocity or waiver; and experience working with American Indian or Alaska Native tribes.

ANNUAL SALARY: \$60,000, plus generous health and vacation benefits.
